# 2015-2016 Model Arab League Agenda

PLEASE NOTE: **not all models will have all councils**. Contact the Local Coordinator or the National Council Representative of your model to find out which councils will be represented.

## Joint Defense Council

- 1. Reviewing progress and defining benchmarks for the unified Arab force specified by the 26th Summit of the League of Arab States
- 2. Countering threats and security challenges posed by militant non-state actors, with special attention paid to groups of a transnational nature
- 3. Proposing policies to address security threats related to refugees and refugee camps in order to assist those displaced by conflict and instability
- 4. Reviewing the Middle East Nuclear Weapon Free Zone to determine a League-wide nuclear policy and a response to developments in the regional nuclear landscape

## **Council on Palestinian Affairs**

- 1. Discussing means to redevelop and secure agricultural land as well as access to natural resources within Palestinian territories
- 2. Exploring a role for the League in encouraging routine discussion amongst Palestinian factions and a coordinated approach for facilitating state affairs
- 3. Devising methods to improve access to power, electricity, and water utilities in occupied Palestinian territories, bearing in mind restrictions on imported materials
- 4. Addressing legal issues and developing concrete proposals related to the identity and citizenship status of Palestinians living in East Jerusalem

## **Council on Political Affairs**

- 1. Developing League-wide strategies to deter outside influence and to maintain political sovereignty and self-determination in light of regional developments
- 2. Considering the effects of sectarianism and gender participation on the political systems of Arab states
- 3. Defining conditions and parameters on which future League-sponsored negotiations with insurgent groups in the region might be based
- 4. Exploring the effects and repercussions of changing geopolitical realities with regard to regional neighbors and developing protocols to mitigate potential risks

#### **Council of Arab Social Affairs Ministers**

- 1. Addressing literacy amongst Arab populations, with special emphasis on those in areas of conflict
- 2. Combating cross-border criminal activities with negative societal impacts including but not limited to human trafficking and drug smuggling
- 3. Considering the environments and conditions which increase the risk of radicalization by and recruitment for extremist groups, and establishing tactics to prevent or counter them
- 4. Examining disparities in access to healthcare in order to protect against and prevent epidemics and outbreaks

## **Council of Arab Environmental Affairs Ministers**

- 1. Exploring private and public support for new technologies to reduce carbon emissions such as efficiency standards, carbon-capture, renewables, and new fuels
- 2. Evaluating methods for sustainable agricultural development, particularly in post-conflict areas, to reverse soil erosion, salt intrusion, overuse of fertilizers and pesticides, etc.
- 3. Developing strategies to promote economic opportunities in sectors with a low impact on the environment such as technology, education, and services
- 4. Discussing the protection of native endangered and threatened animals and plants within the region and the implementation of conservation measures

## **Council of Arab Economic Affairs Ministers**

- 1. Addressing the implications of changes to sanctions regimes in the region, including any possible dangers to and areas of benefit for member states
- 2. Devising a League-wide strategy to combat the generation and transference of funding for militant and criminal organizations,
- 3. Investing in the knowledge economy, growing and sustaining the strength of informationbased sectors, and laying the foundation for a future transition to a more diverse economy
- 4. Evaluating the economic effects of refugee populations within member states and developing economic provisions for displaced people

### Summit of Arab Heads of State

- 1. Encouraging League-wide economic diversification, emphasizing cooperation that capitalizes on complementary comparative advantages
- 2. Confronting the self-proclaimed Islamic State and its affiliates through military, ideological, financial, and political means
- 3. Exploring effective strategies for employing humanitarian assistance to refugees and others displaced by regional conflict
- 4. Discussing challenges to the existing regional order, with special consideration given to the breakdown of borders and emergence of new states

## Special Council on Religion and Extremism

- 1. Countering the use of propaganda by extremist groups, paying particular attention to webbased media and the use of the internet as a means to spread extremist ideology
- 2. Exploring the ideological roots of extremist groups in the region and their connection to sectarianism, political vacuums, and the lack of social services
- 3. Assessing the role of religious minorities in the region and their place in the economy, society, politics and government processes
- 4. Identifying paths to radicalization, particularly for Arab youth, and the most effective methods for de-radicalization, rehabilitation, and reintegration into society both economically and societally
